Some CHASS students want to work on the Life Sciences Core (LSC) curriculum for the purpose of applying to professional school to pursue careers in Dentistry, Medicine, Pharmacology, Nursing, Physical and Occupational Therapy and other health care related fields. The LSC requires 72 units of coursework as listed below:

BIOL 5A and 5LA, BIOL 5B, BIOL 5C
CHEM 1A and 1LA, CHEM 1B and 1LB, CHEM 1C and 1LC
CHEM 12A, CHEM 12B, CHEM 12C
MATH 5 or MATH 6A and 6B, and MATH 9A, and 9B
PHYS 2A and 2LA, PHYS 2B and 2LB, PHYS 2C and 2LC
BCH 100 or BCH 110A
STAT 100A

Students interested in working on the LSC must agree to the following policy:

- No repeats on LSC courses (this includes ARC035)
- Must take all courses for a letter grade and receive no less than C- in LSC courses
- Must complete LSC, breadth, and major requirements within 216 unit maximum
- Must complete all lower division major related courses by the end of sophomore year
- Cumulative GPA requirement of 3.0
- Must meet with major advisor to determine number of elective units degree program allows
 - After major and breadth requirements I have ____ elective units
- A meeting with the Health Professions Advising Center is strongly advised: hpac.ucr.edu*

Not every student will be eligible to complete the LSC. Permission to work on the LSC is contingent on satisfactory progress in both the LSC and your CHASS major. If these conditions are not met, your academic advisor will place a hold on your registration and could discontinue you from the major.
